Congratulations - we are so pleased to hear that you are getting married!

In order to get married in a Church of England church, 'banns of marriage' are required. These need to be applied for by the couple, and 'published' (i.e. read out) by the minister over the course of three consecutive Sunday services prior to the wedding. A banns certificate will then be issued to the couple, which they will then need to present to the church where they are to be married.

If you are intending to marry at a church other than St John's Community Church, you will need to fill in the form opposite (please keep this side for future reference), and return it to:

If your wedding is to be at St John's Community Church, you will need to fill in a different form, which can be downloaded from the church website or is available from the Church Office.

Whether you're getting married at St John's or elsewhere, we do hope you'll be able to join us at our 10.30am Sunday morning services to hear your banns being read - we'll let you know the relevant dates in due course.

If you have any questions about the rules regarding which church you may be able to get married in, banns of marriage, or which form to fill in, please do get in touch with the Parish Office.

The fee for reading banns and receiving a certificate is £40.00. Please make cheques payable to St John's Community Church and hand it in at the Church Office when you collect your banns certificate.
